Watch your gutters and keep them cleaned out. You don't want to risk having all the ice back up in the gutters and coming into your home...that is a big problem. Make sure you turn your water to the outside faucets off--again, you don't want those to freeze up on you. Andy Contracting cleaned the gutters of some of the folks on Rockefeller and they were pleased...His number is 703-789-7444. If you haven't cleaned your chimney in quite a while, don't risk a potential problem as you are enjoying a nice evening sitting by the fire. Burn only hardwood. Another thing to know, with the age of our homes, most of us have crowns at the top of the chimney which have cracked and some bad enough that the water can enter and go down into the chimney...you need to get that repaired and of course make sure you have a cap on your chimney so the critters don't make their home in your chimney...Rodney Barnes with A1 Chimney has done many in the area...703-296-7636. Rooftop Chimney Sweeps is another..703-836-7858. Finally, if you are renting your home....read your lease and know that typically you as the tenant are responsible for frozen pipes, gutters and the yard....I hope you all have a comfortable winter ahead of you and please know if your home is having a problem of any type, call me and let me share a name or two with you. IT IS NOT TOO EARLY TO THINK ABOUT SNOW!

Snow is predicted this year so it is not too early to be prepared. Fortunately, when we do get a heavy snow most residents of Winston Knolls are responsible about clearing their sidewalks of snow. Unfortunately, there are some residents who do not clear their sidewalks and allow the snow to build up or harden into ice, which is even more treacherous for those walking on sidewalks. It is important that sidewalks on school routes are clear for our young people. We do not want to risk injury to anyone^{\$} child because they moved into the street because of impassable sidewalks. Although not legally obligated, citizens are asked by VDOT to keep sidewalks safe. All residents should, as soon as feasible, clear snow off the sidewalks in front of their property so that all pedestrians, especially school children, those with disabilities, and the elderly, may walk securely. The Winston Knolls Civic Association has decided to help those who are unable to clear their sidewalks of snow. The association will compile a list of individuals who need assistance shoveling snow. The association will also compile a list of teenagers or individuals who are willing to shovel snow either for community service hours or for pay. If you have medical or other legitimate reasons why you are unable to shovel snow on your property and wish to have assistance please complete the following form. If you are interested in being on a list to be called to help with shoveling snow, please also complete the following form. Indicate if you are interested in being paid or if you wish to shovel snow to fulfill community service requirements for school or Boy or Girl Scouts. If under age 13 be sure to get your parent's permission before signing up to shovel snow. The above information will be placed on a data sheet and shared with those seeking help.
