#### Message from Winston Knolls President

I would like to address the present situation that we have with the Civic Association. I am not asking for money at present, but rather I want to explain our present situation. We are like the rest of the people in the U.S. digging out of COVID-19 and dealing with the after effects. As I have stated before, the county government has not resumed all of their normal operations, therefore, the Large Pickup, twice a year service that we use to enjoy has not resumed as yet.

We are trying to get back to normal, hence the Halloween party on 29 October, but this leads me to the financial situation of the Civic Association. In the past two years due to the pandemic and other variables we have only had approximately a 45 – 50% participation. One will say if you are not spending that much over the last few years due to COVID-19, then we should be in good shape. However, the cost of maintaining the status quo has gone up, for example, cutting and maintaining the median and sign area has risen by 25% (we explored several options and companies to alleviate the increased expense, but staying with Premium was the best option); insurance and post office raised their rates; the party in October will cost us a little over \$1,000.00; then there is the newsletter; Directory; website, etc. Please do not misunderstand me, I and the Board believe that the Civic Association's charter is to deliver as many services and activities we can for the community and not to have a big balance in the bank. But, we must be able to pay our basic bills and have enough left over to be effective.

Which brings me to another situation, I have been the president of the Civic Association since 2011 and like myself we have board members that also have been serving between 8-10 years and even longer in different capacities. In fact, we have not had a Secretary for the last 15 months. The association is in need of younger and new Board Members, plus new ideas. I am aware of the burden of having young children and also keeping up with their events in school and sports, however, I am asking that if there is anyone in the community that could spare approximately 20-25 hours yearly or some computer time, please give the Civic Association some thought. Also, ask your teenager if they need community credit, we could use their computer skills, canvasing ability, etc.

My intention was not to come across as doom and gloom, but I do want to be honest and explain where the Civic Association stands at present. I have enjoyed working for the community and we have several remarkable families and individuals in Winston Knolls, I just want to ensure we deliver to the best of our ability. The last thought I want to leave you with is when we start our annual membership drive after the New Year, please think hard about renewing or joining the Civic Association, <u>\$20.00</u> is a small price for such a big return.
